Biology	2 courses	<i>BIOL 211 Principles of Biology I</i> <i>BIOL 212 Principles of Biology II</i> <i>And corresponding labs</i> Other Biology courses including anatomy & physiology, botany, cell biology, genetics, microbiology, neurobiology, zoology.
Chemistry General or Inorganic	2 courses	<i>CHEM 215 General Chemistry I</i> <i>CHEM 216 General Chemistry I Laboratory</i> <i>CHEM 225 General Chemistry II</i> <i>CHEM 226 General Chemistry II Laboratory</i>
Chemistry Organic or Biochemistry	2 courses	<i>CHEM 325 Organic Chemistry I</i> <i>CHEM 326 Organic Chemistry Laboratory</i> <i>CHEM 335 Organic Chemistry II</i> <i>CHEM 336 Organic Chemistry II Laboratory</i>
Physics	2 courses	<i>PHYS 100 College Physics I</i> <i>PHYS 101 College Physics II</i> <i>And corresponding labs</i> Statistics, exercise physiology, biomechanics, or kinesiology may be accepted for <i>one</i> Physics course.
Psychology	3 semester hours	<i>PSYCH 155 General Psychology</i> Other psychology courses including abnormal, child, community, developmental, experimental, educational, perceptual.
Social Science/Humanities	15 semester hours	Social Science/Humanities courses including those in economics, education, history, political science, psychology, anthropology, art/drama/music/film history or appreciation, languages, literature, english, logic, philosophy, and religion.

Science prerequisites are listed as guidelines only, and may vary. Students should contact the Office of Admissions to determine the exact science coursework required. All non-science credit hour requirements are as listed.

Each course must transfer at the baccalaureate level with a minimum 2.0 on a 4.0 scale. Students must have earned a baccalaureate degree with a minimum GPA of 3.00 on a 4.0 scale. However, those students with a cumulative GPA between 2.75-2.99 may be considered for admissions under an Alternative Admissions Track (AATP). Please refer to the National University of Health Sciences Bulletin for additional admission requirements.
