English	6 semester hours	<i>ENG 101 First-Year Composition I</i> <i>ENG 102 First-Year Composition II</i> Other english, communications, literature, or writing courses.
Biology	2 courses	<i>BIO 120 Principles of Biology I</i> <i>BIO 122 Principles of Biology II</i> <i>And corresponding labs</i> Other Biology courses including anatomy & physiology, botany, cell biology, genetics, microbiology, neurobiology, zoology.
Chemistry General or Inorganic	2 courses	<i>CHM 121 General Chemistry</i> <i>CHM 122 Chemistry and Qualitative Analysis</i> <i>And corresponding labs</i>
Chemistry Organic or Biochemistry	2 courses	<i>CHM 231 Organic Chemistry I</i> <i>CHM 232 Organic Chemistry II</i> <i>And corresponding labs</i>
Physics	2 courses	<i>PHY 221 General Physics I</i> <i>PHY 222 General Physics II</i> <i>And corresponding labs</i> Statistics, exercise physiology, biomechanics, or kinesiology may be accepted for one Physics course.
Psychology	3 semester hours	<i>PSY 100 Introduction to Psychology</i> Other Psychology courses including abnormal, child, community, developmental, experimental, educational, perceptual.
Social Science/Humanities	15 semester hours	Social Science/Humanities courses including those in economics, education, history, political science, psychology, anthropology, art/drama/music/film history or appreciation, languages, literature, english, logic, philosophy, and religion.

Science prerequisites are listed as guidelines only, and may vary. Students should contact the Office of Admissions to determine the exact science coursework required. All non-science credit hour requirements are as listed.

Each course must transfer at the baccalaureate level with a minimum 2.0 on a 4.0 scale. Students must have earned a baccalaureate degree with a minimum GPA of 3.00 on a 4.0 scale. However, those students with a cumulative GPA between 2.75-2.99 may be considered for admissions under an Alternative Admissions Track (AATP). Please refer to the National University of Health Sciences Bulletin for additional admission requirements.
