English	6 semester hours	<i>ENG 105 Composition I</i> <i>ENG 106 Composition II</i> Other English, communications, literature, or writing courses.
Biology	2 courses	<i>BIO 112 General Biology 1</i> <i>BIO 113 General Biology II</i> And corresponding labs. Other Biology courses including anatomy & physiology, botany, cell biology, genetics, microbiology, neurobiology, zoology.
Chemistry General or Inorganic	2 courses	<i>CHM 165 General/Inorganic Chemistry I</i> <i>CHM 175 General/Inorganic Chemistry II</i> And corresponding labs.
Chemistry Organic or Biochemistry	2 courses	<i>CHM 263 Organic Chemistry I</i> <i>CHM 273 Organic Chemistry II</i> And corresponding labs.
Physics	2 courses	<i>PHY 160 College Physics I</i> <i>PHY 161 College Physics II</i> Statistics, exercise physiology, biomechanics, or kinesiology may be accepted for <i>one</i> Physics course.
Psychology	3 semester hours	<i>PSY 111 Introduction to Psychology</i> Other Psychology courses including abnormal, child, community, developmental, experimental, educational, perceptual.
Social Science/Humanities	15 semester hours	Social Science/Humanities courses including those in economics, education, history, political science, psychology, anthropology, art/drama/music/film history or appreciation, languages, literature, english, logic, philosophy, and religion.

Science prerequisites are listed as guidelines only, and may vary. Students should contact the Office of Admissions to determine the exact science coursework required. All non-science credit hour requirements are as listed.

Each course must transfer at the baccalaureate level with a minimum 2.0 on a 4.0 scale. Students must have earned a baccalaureate degree with a minimum GPA of 3.00 on a 4.0 scale. However, those students with a cumulative GPA between 2.75-2.99 may be considered for admissions under an Alternative Admissions Track (AATP). Please refer to the National University of Health Sciences Bulletin for additional admission requirements.
