English	6 semester hours	<i>ENGL 101 Rhetoric and Composition</i> <i>ENGL 102 Research Writing</i> Other English, communications, literature, or writing courses.
Biology	2 courses	<i>BIOL 213 Anatomy and Physiology I</i> <i>BIOL 241 Anatomy and Physiology II</i> Other Biology courses including anatomy & physiology, botany, cell biology, genetics, microbiology, neurobiology, zoology.
Chemistry General or Inorganic	2 courses	<i>CHEM 110 General Chemistry I</i> <i>CHEM 112 General Chemistry II</i> And corresponding labs.
Chemistry Organic or Biochemistry	2 courses	<i>CHEM 201 Organic Chemistry I</i> <i>CHEM 202 Organic Chemistry II</i> And corresponding labs.
Physics	2 courses	<i>PHYS 201 Elements of Physics I</i> <i>PHYS 202 Elements of Physics II</i> Statistics, exercise physiology, biomechanics, or kinesiology may be accepted for one Physics course.
Psychology	3 semester hours	<i>PSYC 201 Introduction to Psychology</i> Other Psychology courses including abnormal, child, community, developmental, experimental, educational, perceptual.
Social Science/Humanities	15 semester hours	Social Science/Humanities courses including those in economics, education, history, political science, psychology, anthropology, art/drama/music/film history or appreciation, languages, literature, english, logic, philosophy, and religion.

Science prerequisites are listed as guidelines only, and may vary. Students should contact the Office of Admissions to determine the exact science coursework required. All non-science credit hour requirements are as listed.

Each course must transfer at the baccalaureate level with a minimum 2.0 on a 4.0 scale. Students must have earned a baccalaureate degree with a minimum GPA of 3.00 on a 4.0 scale. However, those students with a cumulative GPA between 2.75-2.99 may be considered for admissions under an Alternative Admissions Track (AATP). Please refer to the National University of Health Sciences Bulletin for additional admission requirements.
