English	6 semester hours	<i>ENG 110 College Writing I</i> <i>ENG 111 College Writing II</i> Other English, communications, literature, or writing courses.
Biology	2 courses	<i>BIO 101 Cellular Biology</i> <i>BIO 104 Organismal Biology</i> <i>And corresponding labs</i> Other Biology courses including anatomy & physiology, botany, cell biology, genetics, microbiology, neurobiology, zoology.
Chemistry General or Inorganic	2 courses	<i>CHM 120 General Chemistry I</i> <i>CHM 130 General Chemistry II</i> <i>And corresponding labs</i>
Chemistry Organic or Biochemistry	2 courses	<i>CHM 220 Organic Chemistry I</i> <i>CHM 230 Organic Chemistry II</i> <i>And corresponding labs</i>
Physics	2 courses	<i>PHY 111 College Physics I</i> <i>PHY 112 College Physics II</i> <i>And corresponding labs</i> Statistics, exercise physiology, biomechanics, or kinesiology may be accepted for <i>one</i> Physics course.
Psychology	3 semester hours	<i>PSY 150 Introductory Psychology</i> Other Psychology courses including abnormal, child, community, developmental, experimental, educational, perceptual.
Social Science/Humanities	15 semester hours	Social Science/Humanities courses including those in economics, education, history, political science, psychology, anthropology, art/drama/music/film history or appreciation, languages, literature, english, logic, philosophy, and religion.

Science prerequisites are listed as guidelines only, and may vary. Students should contact the Office of Admissions to determine the exact science coursework required. All non-science credit hour requirements are as listed.

Each course must transfer at the baccalaureate level with a minimum 2.0 on a 4.0 scale. Students must have earned a baccalaureate degree with a minimum GPA of 3.00 on a 4.0 scale. However, those students with a cumulative GPA between 2.75-2.99 may be considered for admissions under an Alternative Admissions Track (AATP). Please refer to the National University of Health Sciences Bulletin for additional admission requirements.
