Social Science/Humanities	15 semester hours	Social Science/Humanities courses including those in economics, education, history, political science, psychology, anthropology, art/drama/music/film history or appreciation, languages, literature, english, logic, philosophy, and religion.

Each course must transfer at the baccalaureate level with a minimum 2.0 on a 4.0 scale. Students must have earned a baccalaureate degree with a minimum *cumulative* GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale. Priority admission will be granted to students with a 3.0 cumulative GPA if qualified applications exceed the number of spaces available. Please refer to the National University of Health Sciences *Bulletin* for additional admission requirements.
