| Psychology | 3 semester hours | PSY 101 Introduction to Psychology Other psychology courses including abnormal, child, community, developmental, experimental, educational, perceptual. |
| Social Science/Humanities | 15 semester hours | Social Science/Humanities courses including those in economics, education, history, political science, psychology, anthropology, art/drama/music/film history or appreciation, languages, literature, english, logic, philosophy, and religion. |

Each course must transfer at the baccalaureate level with a minimum 2.0 on a 4.0 scale. Students must have earned a baccalaureate degree with a minimum *cumulative* GPA of 3.00 on a 4.0 scale. However, those students with a cumulative GPA between 2.75-2.99 may be considered for admissions under an Alternative Admissions Track (AATP).
