English	6 semester hours	<i>ENG 105 Expository Writing</i> <i>ENG 106 Argumentative and Research Writing</i> Other English, communications, literature, or writing courses.
Biology	2 courses	<i>BIO 101 Biological Principles I</i> <i>BIO 102 Biological Principles II</i> <i>And corresponding labs</i> Other Biology courses including anatomy & physiology, botany, cell biology, genetics, microbiology, neurobiology, zoology.
Chemistry General or Inorganic	2 courses	<i>CHE 101 Principles of Chemistry I</i> <i>CHE151 Principles of Chemistry Laboratory I</i> <i>CHE 102 Principles of Chemistry II</i> <i>CHE152 Principles of Chemistry Laboratory II</i>
Chemistry Organic or Biochemistry	2 courses	<i>CHE 201 Organic Chemistry</i> <i>CHE 251 Organic Chemistry I Lab</i> <i>CHE 202 Organic Chemistry II</i> <i>CHE 252 Organic Chemistry II Lab</i>
Physics	2 courses	<i>PHS 201 General Physics I</i> <i>PHS 202 General Physics II</i> <i>And corresponding Labs</i> Statistics, exercise physiology, biomechanics, or kinesiology may be accepted for <i>one</i> Physics course.
Psychology	3 semester hours	<i>PSY 101 General Psychology</i> Other psychology courses including abnormal, child, community, developmental, experimental, educational, and perceptual.
Social Science/Humanities	15 semester hours	Social Science/Humanities courses including those in economics, education, history, political science, psychology, anthropology, art/drama/music/film history or appreciation, languages, literature, english, logic, philosophy, and religion.

Science prerequisites are listed as guidelines only, and may vary. Students should contact the Office of Admissions to determine the exact science coursework required. All non-science credit hour requirements are as listed.

Each course must transfer at the baccalaureate level with a minimum 2.0 on a 4.0 scale. Students must have earned a baccalaureate degree with a minimum GPA of 3.00 on a 4.0 scale. However, those students with a cumulative GPA between 2.75-2.99 may be considered for admissions under an Alternative Admissions Track (AATP). Please refer to the National University of Health Sciences Bulletin for additional admission requirements.
