HEALTH-RELATED, POPULATION SPECIFIC, CURRICULA FOR THE CHIROPRACTIC PROFESSION: A LITERATURE REVIEW AND MODIFIED DELPHI STUDY

There are few published sources for patient-centered topics related to health and public health chiropractic practices for targeted populations such as adults (women/men), youth (infant/children/adolescents), seniors (older/aging adults), workers (eg, including athletes and military), and special populations (eg, underserved, high risk groups, minorities, disabilities). The purpose of this project is to develop consensus-driven, evidence-based, patient-centered curricula for chiropractic programs. For each of the five target populations, we will perform a literature review. Based on the findings, we will create seed statements for competencies and learning objectives that focus on the specific patient populations. (RS-2401)
