POLICY STATEMENT

States and other government entities have established standards of practice for the occupations or professions they have chosen to regulate, and they provide legal permission to practice those professions only to individuals who meet those standards. This is called professional licensure: professions for which people need to meet certain criteria in order to practice in that field.

The United States Department of Education (the "DoE") and National Council for State Authorization Reciprocity Agreements ("SARA") issue licensure and registration requirements by state.

The DoE is requiring all institutions that offer programs that require state licensure/registration to inform all incoming students of which states the institution's professional programs meet those requirements thereby, allowing a graduate to practice in that state. SARA is administering the process. One of the requirements is to define an official location policy specific to these requirements.

Location Policy:

All new DC (Doctor of Chiropractic), ND (Doctor of Naturopathic Medicine), and AHM (Master and Doctor of Acupuncture and Herbal Medicine) students have been determined to be in-person and located on-campus at the Illinois or Florida site at the time of initial enrollment, which is defined as the first day of class of their first trimester of attendance.
