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Effective Spring Trimester 2024, due to a program update, the course **COM111 – First Trimester Seminar** is added to the Bachelor of Science in Biomedical Sciences degree requirements. All new BS students are required to enroll in COM111, a 7.5 week, online, first trimester seminar course. This course is part of the 124 credit-hour requirement for the BS program.

In this mandatory, 1.0 credit hour, online synchronous course, first trimester BS in Biomedical Sciences students will have the opportunity to become acquainted with students in their cohort, gain additional knowledge about university policies and procedures, and develop a sense of belonging within the University through various topics each week. This course will focus on helping students develop their critical reading and writing skills, allow them to explore career opportunities in the healthcare profession, educate students on the importance of academic integrity and professional ethics, and share discussions on diversity. Students will learn about time management, study skills, test taking strategies, and NUHS library resources. Following the first class, students will have an opportunity to agree on a set time and day for this synchronous course to occur for the remaining weeks.

The study of human organ systems includes mechanisms of control using negative feedback. Processes such as bulk, laminar, and turbulent flow as applied to different organ systems are taught. Other significant topics taught include the function and movement of molecules across cell membranes as applied to the respiratory, circulatory, digestive, renal, and reproductive systems, and the alteration and regulation of those activities by local, hormonal and neural inputs.

The following programs offered by National University of Health Sciences are accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Acupuncture and Herbal Medicine (ACAHM):

The programs listed above may offer courses via distance education.

ACAHM does not accredit any programs at the undergraduate/bachelor level.

The Doctor of Acupuncture program offered by National University of Health Sciences is approved to begin enrolling students but is not accredited by ACAHM. This program is eligible for ACAHM accreditation, and National University is currently in the process of seeking ACAHM accreditation for the program. However, National University can provide no assurance that

accreditation will be granted by ACAHM. Graduates of an unaccredited program are not considered to have graduated from an ACAHM-accredited program and may not rely on ACAHM accreditation for professional licensure or other purposes. Page 64 – A procedural update has been added to the College of Professional Studies Academic Policies, Regulations & Procedures:

### **Last Trimester in the Didactic Course Remediation**

An 8th trimester DC, 9th trimester for ND, 6th trimester MAc/DAC, or MAc-HM 8th trimester student who has not completed all courses specified in the first 8 DC/9 ND/6 MAc/DAC/8 MAc-HM trimesters, and who are deficient in one of the .8 DC/9 ND/6 MAc/DAC/8 MAc-HM trimester courses and who has received a grade of "F" or "U" in one course only (except for student clinic, which must be passed), may choose to repeat the course prior to entering the following trimester clinic course, or may choose to take and pass an examination on the course by paying the course fee. The examination must be completed no later than two days prior to the end of the third week of the following trimester for which the students are otherwise eligible. These exams will be managed by the chair of the appropriate department.
