When you are off-campus, you can access most electronic journals, books and streaming videos by clicking on the "A-to-Z (Full Text Finder)" on the library's eResources page. When you are prompted for a log-in, enter your 14-digit library bar code and your pin number. For remote access, you must have a current library card for the NUHS library (current students must update their card in our system each year).

Please remember to use the links provided on the eResources page. They will provide increased access to full text and also provide usage statistics to support continued availability.

Monographs

Books on Acupuncture and on Oriental medicine might be found in all of our book collections but especially in the general circulating collection, in the reserve collection (textbooks recommended and/or required by instructor) and in our Special Collections area (classic titles; in-library use only).

Please remember that although there are specific areas where most books on a subject will be located, some books will be located in other subject areas. Here are some examples:

- Information on **Chinese medicines and herbs** might be located in the **QV (QV 717, QV 766-QV 767, QV 770)** with other titles on **pharmacology** and in **WB 925 (Herbalism)**.
- Books on **veterinary acupuncture** will be found around **SF 914.5**.
- **Practice of Medicine (WB)** might contain some **acupuncture**, including **Outlines (WB 18)**, **Handbooks (WB 39)** and **Atlases (WB 17)** but especially **Medical Practice (WB 50-50.1)** which includes many titles on **use of traditional and Oriental medicine**. Also

consider specific aspects, such as palpatory **diagnosis** (**WB 275**) or **diet therapy** (**WB 400**).

- Books on **History of Medicine** will be found with other **History of Medicine** books (but especially specific groups, such as Asian, might be found in **WZ 70** or **WZ 80.5** and **modern editions of early works** might be found in **WZ 290**).

You might wish to use the library's online catalog to locate other specialized subject areas (e.g., **QU 105** for body fluids in TCM, **WE 344** for **Arthritis** for titles such as *Qigong for Arthritis*, **WP 140** for acupuncture in gynecology, **WQ 160** for acupuncture in midwifery or **WQ 175** for acupuncture in prenatal care)

Books on Oriental medicine and acupuncture are usually found in the following areas of the collections:

WB 369 (Acupuncture. Moxibustion)

WB 371 (Cupping)

WB 537 (Acupressure, Massage)

One final note: books on **basic sciences** aspects are found in subject areas represented by the letter **Q** (e.g., **Physiology**, **Biochemistry** and **Pharmacology** in the listings above), while books on **clinical sciences** aspects are located in subject areas represented by the letter **W** (e.g., **Practice of Medicine** in the listings above).
